"In a sharp escalation over the migrant crisis, Mayor Eric Adams claimed in stark terms that New York City was being destroyed by an influx of 110,000 asylum seekers from the southern border and said that he did not see a way to fix the issue. 'Let me tell you something New Yorkers, never in my life have I had a problem that I did not see an ending to I don't see an ending to this,' the mayor said on Wednesday night in his opening remarks at a town hall-style gathering in Manhattan. Avlon Said The Biden Administration Could Use TPS For Venezuelans And Start Enforcing Asylum Laws To Ease The Problem Without Congressional Action. AVLON: "So how could you solve it absent congressional action? Well, there are two ideas that I think the Biden administration can and should do. One, there's a -- there's a thing called temporary -- TPS, Temporary Protected Status. ... And that is something that can be applied to Venezuelans who are the first wave of these immigration -- immigrants that would reduce some of the pressure. The second thing is start enforcing asylum laws on the books. Not everyone is a legitimate asylum seeker. You shouldn't just take them at their word. Some folks are coming here for a better life. That's a great American story. But it's not reflective of the reason asylum seeker laws are in place. So those need to be enforced more strictly. And then you should look at some of the work requirements, which are currently 180 days. Those things can be done without congressional approval.
